MONDAY, APRIL 15

Dinosaur Park

Laurel

Limited to the first 80 children enrolled.

Bus times:

First group: Departs 9:15am and returns at 12:30pm
Second group: Departs 11:45am and returns at 3pm

All children must be at Cradlerock by 9am.

Walk the same ground that dinosaurs did millions of years ago and discover secrets of Maryland's prehistoric past. Join us in unearthing the prehistory of Prince George's County at Dinosaur Park. The park is a unique site in Laurel that preserves a rare deposit of fossils from the early Cretaceous period, about 115 million years ago. From the bones and teeth of the Maryland state dinosaur — *Astrodon johnstoni* — to the remains of early flowering plants, the fossils found at Dinosaur Park help scientists reconstruct our region's ancient history.

TUESDAY, APRIL 16

Catoctin Wildlife Preserve

Thurmont

Bears and boas, macaws and monkeys, panthers and pythons — everything from alligators to zebras await you in this 50-acre park!

Catoctin Wildlife Preserve features amazing experiences and hundreds of exciting new exotic animal friends, with more interactive touch and feed opportunities than any other animal park in the region. Feel the silky soft fur of the chinchilla or the bumpy shell of a tortoise at daily educational talks. Or get nose-to-nose with camels, bison, ostriches, zebras and more.

You will be welcomed by natural ponds, lush landscaping, and wandering Ambass-zoo-dors, eager to indulge inquisitive guests. These amazing animals are our extended family and vital ambassadors for their species. Through our personal style of exhibition and education, we know that they will be your extended family, too.

As an added treat, we have the option to participate in a camel ride (please indicate on the registration form if you would like your child to participate in this option)! Wear your walking shoes — there's lots to see.

WEDNESDAY, APRIL 17

Clark's Elioak Farm


Ellicott City

Clark's Elioak Farm is a historic farm covering 540 acres. All of the acreage is part of county or state farmland protection programs. The Clarks, a family with a tradition of farming in Maryland spanning seven generations, have owned the Elioak farm since 1927.

Our visit to their historic farm will include a guided tour of the petting farm, a chance to feed and pet the animals, tours of the garden and pond habitats, and visiting the Enchanted Forest Pine Tree Forest and play areas. And before we depart for the day, we'll take a ride on the cow train!

THURSDAY, APRIL 18

Jug Bay Wetlands Sanctuary

Lothian



Limited to the first 50 children enrolled.

Bus departs at 9am and returns at 3pm

Jug Bay Wetlands Sanctuary consists of 1,700 acres of open water, tidal freshwater marshes, forested wetlands, upland and riparian forest, creeks, meadows, pine and sand barrens, and fields along the Patuxent River. Located in southern Anne Arundel County, the sanctuary is a designated site on the Patuxent Water Trail.

The sanctuary is located in the tidal reaches of the Patuxent River, and its network of habitats, including its extensive tidal freshwater wetlands, provides a safe environment to a high diversity of plants, invertebrates, birds, fish, reptiles, and mammal species. The National Audubon Society has designated the Sanctuary as a Nationally Important Bird Area.

In addition to our tour of these beautiful wetlands, we'll have the opportunity to participate in some hands-on experiences learning about life in the forest and habitats. This trip is rain or shine.

Our trip includes forest stream and wetlands activities — please follow these guidelines!

- Wear old clothes that can get dirty and wet.
- Wear comfortable, closed-toe walking shoes that can get dirty. Rubber boots or waterproof shoes are great for pond, stream studies, or a rainy day. No flip-flops or open-toe shoes/sandals. High socks are recommended to protect visitors from ticks.
- Dress in layers. It is hard to learn when you are uncomfortable.
- Hats and sunscreen are recommended.
- An extra pair of socks and shoes is recommended if you are participating in a pond program.
- Raincoats and hats are necessary if rain is predicted.

We will still go out in the rain. No umbrellas, please.



Baltimore Museum of Industry

Baltimore



Limited to the first 50 children enrolled.

Bus departs at 9:30am and returns at 2pm

Baltimore Museum of Industry is a museum in Baltimore located in an old cannery with exhibits on various types of manufacturing and industry from the early 20th century. There are several hands-on sections with working equipment and other artifacts.

The museum was founded in 1977 as a project by the mayor's office to preserve the industrial history of downtown Baltimore. The BMI galleries recreate parts of a cannery, a garment loft from 1900, a machine shop from 1900, a print shop, Dr. Bunting's Pharmacy (where Noxzema was invented), as well as exhibits on the food industry in Baltimore (McCormick, Domino Sugar, Esskay).

In the Decker Gallery, the Milestone Wall documents inventions and processes discovered first in Baltimore and Maryland. The BMI is also home to the Baltimore, the oldest surviving steam tugboat and a National Historic Landmark. The library consists of more than 5,000 volumes of rare and historic books. The manuscript collections cover all major industries in Baltimore, including canning, the cloth trades, violin making, and the steel industry. The photographic collections hold more than 250,000 prints and negatives, including the Baltimore Gas and Electric Company Print and Negative Collection. Our visit will include a tour of the exhibits and hands-on engineering opportunities.

MONDAY, APRIL 22


Annapolis Harbor Cruise and Naval Academy Tour
